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APG Submits Comments As Prior Authorization Bills Advance To Hearing

Four pending bills on prior authorization are advancing to their first legislative hearing next week. APG has taken an oppose unless amended position on all four of the bills, AB 510, AB 512, AB 539 and SB 306. All four bills are sponsored by the California Medical Association. During last weeks California Policy Committee meeting, APG California Board members reached consensus on the position. The bills would apply to licensed health plans and then require delegated risk-bearing organizations to comply with the new provisions. In sum, the bills would make the following changes to the prior authorization process:

- Remove any code or service that is approved 90% or more in the preceding year from any further prior authorization review for the following year
- Require that all review of standard requests be conducted within 48 hours, with urgent matters handled within 24 hours
- Require that all appeals and grievances be conducted within two business days by a physician of the same specialty as the requesting physician

 Require that all authorizations are good for one calendar year, with no exceptions

APG is working with other stakeholders on the opposition. We have met with the legislators carrying the bills and other members of the Assembly and Health Committees. The bills will be heard next Tuesday and Wednesday in Sacramento and APG will provide testimony. You can read all four of our comment letters here. As the bills move forward through the process we will be issuing a call to action to our members and providing further information.

APG To Disseminate Findings From The Duals Experience In CA Physician-led, Value-based Care Organizations Project

In 2024, APG was awarded a grant by CHCF to examine enablers and barriers for provider groups to participate in Dual Eligible Special Needs Plan (D-SNP) provider networks.

APG is now drafting three briefs for specific target audiences (DHCS, CA DSNP health plans, and CA providers/RBOs) that cover topics discussed and insights gained through our focus groups and key informant interview activities with APG's CA risk-bearing provider organizations. Topics include

DSNP and state-specific MOC implementation experience, provider interest/capacity to care for Duals, coordination of benefits, data sharing/interoperability, care coordination needs, and corresponding improvement strategies and recommendations. APG CMO, Dr Susan Huang, will provide an overview and presentation to APG CA members between June and September, prior to the release of the Briefs.

APG will also engage in meetings with DHCS and with directors at local initiative health plans to share findings and discuss opportunities for collaborating more effectively to serve dual-eligible beneficiaries in CA.
