APG And Its Members Fight Increased MLR Of 90% In Medi-Cal

Several APG members are getting the word out across their communities and with their elected legislators about the Governor's budget proposal to increase the Medi-Cal managed care medical loss ratio (MLR) from 85 percent to 90 percent. Their message – this policy will wipe out the use of provider delegation within this program, resulting in increased annual costs for care delivery in the range of \$5-6 billion. The proposal was first introduced on May 14 in the release of the state budget May Revise. It is being reviewed by the budget committees of the Assembly and State Senate this week. The budget must be voted upon by June 15.

APG is working closely with Medi-Cal plans that delegate to our members, trade associations and other stakeholders to explain how this policy would make it impossible for a plan to delegate to RKK and RBO organizations and still meet the 90 percent medical spend threshold. Upcoming MLR reporting standards will require that only direct medical spend and some limited "quality improvement" functions will be counted toward the MLR. Useful activities like care coordination, population health management and electronic infrastructure development would be counted as administrative expense. Organizations that fail to meet the 90 percent floor would be required to remit "excess revenue." Read our advocacy materials and join our effort.



One Good Thing

This week's One Good Thing story features the Institute for Human Caring, an affiliate of APG member Providence.

Matthew Gonzales, MD, FAAHPM, Chief Medical Officer, spoke at APG's Annual Spring Conference 2024 about work they did that was published in <u>NEJM Catalyst</u> on May 21, 2025 and recently sent us an update on this project.

Dr. Gonzales reports that in 2024, Providence caregivers documented over 8,500 Goals-of-Care (GOC) conversations for critical care patients in the electronic health record—a more than 1,100% increase since 2017. Across all acute care hospitals, Providence caregivers documented over 100,000 GOC conversations last year, with 27% of all non-obstetric adult admissions in 2024 including a documented conversation—up from just 2% in 2017. Behind each of these numbers is a patient and family better supported in making informed decisions that reflect their values, goals, and preferences.
